<u>Growing in Service to the **Community**</u> - UUCBV continues to make connections in the Bryan, College Station, and the wider Brazos Valley communities and is becoming recognized as an important justice partner among both secular and spiritual allies. When we are able to gather the generous resources

Our Board of Trustees has asked our community to raise \$180,000 in pledges for the coming fiscal year. Last year, our annual pledges ranged from \$60 to over \$10,000 with the average pledge being less than \$4000 per year. Last year, more than half of our members increased their pledge from the previous year; if it's possible for you to do that this year, we would be very grateful.
